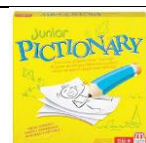

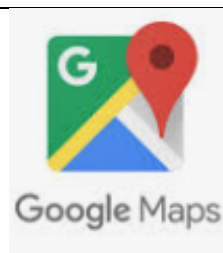
30 Day LEGO Challenge

Choose a theme such as animals, famous buildings, famous people or places near your home.













Using Google Maps – go sightseeing around the world!

	<p>Reading Book Activity (English with Holly on Facebook):</p> <p>Red Task: Get all of your reading books out and organise them in order of favourite to least favourite. Explain to your adult what you loved most about the best one and what you liked least about the worst one.</p> <p>Orange Task: Create a poster for your favourite book that will encourage others to read it. Make sure you include information such as the setting and characters.</p> <p>Yellow Task: With the help of a parent, look for your local library online. Are you able to see what books they have in their collection? Pick 2-3 books that you would like to borrow once the libraries reopen.</p> <p>Green Task: Who is your favourite book character? Write a diary entry as them on their 100th day of quarantine – what would they say? You can also include a drawing to go with your diary entry.</p> <p>Blue Task: Write a letter to your favourite author telling them why you love their book/s and a little about your reading habits. If you are able to, put your letter in the post to them.</p> <p>Purple Task: Write a book review of the last book you read. Include who you would/wouldn't recommend it to and why the characters are interesting. Give it a star rating out of 5 and say why.</p> <p>Note to parents</p> <p>Today's lesson was deliberately planned to cater for a wide range of abilities, needs and learning styles. It is virtually impossible to replicate the tailored lessons that a school classroom can offer, especially for such a broad mix of anonymous learners. Therefore, these lessons have been designed to keep children using their brains, their creativity and (with any luck!) enjoying their learning. Tweak the tasks to suit your child and let me know how you get on.</p>
	<p>Prepare a patch in the garden or a pot in the flat/house for growing your own fruit and vegetables over the coming weeks or months.</p>
	<p>Try making something using origami. https://www.easypeasyandfun.com/easy-origami-for-kids</p>
	<p>Be a police officer and take the fingerprints of everyone in your family (using paint). Add their height and weight and write a description of them.</p>
	<p>Watch a documentary. https://www.fatherly.com/play/movies/best-documentaries-for-kids/</p>

	<p>Making jelly: watch jelly from the packet melt as an adult adds hot water. How does the jelly set? Find out the scientific facts! You can also have fun with some colour mixing and making multi-coloured jelly.</p>
	<p>Recipes: what recipes can you discover and make? Can you write your own? What recipes can you create using five or less simple ingredients?</p>

	<p>Quick mindfulness games:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Touch: put a few mystery items in a paper bag and take turns feeling one object at a time and guess what it is as you describe the texture and shape. • Sight: look around the room in silence for one minute, and point out all of the things you never noticed before. • Sound: set a timer for one minute and count how many different sounds you can hear with your eyes closed, and then share what you heard with each other.
	<p>Paper Airplanes: a few simple folds in a sheet of white paper can provide endless fun! Watch a few YouTube videos to get inspiration beyond the obvious.</p>
	<p>Can you discover a new language while you are at home? How do you say hello? How do you say what your name is? Where you live? Can you describe your family?</p>
